


2014-2018 REPORT ON HIV PREVENTION WORK







The Marine Transport Workers' Trade Union of Ukraine (MTWTU) fully supports the ITF's position on workplace HIV prevention and for more than 10 years has been devoting its attention to this problem.







325 950 new cases of HIV infection officially registered in Ukraine since 1987

Unfortunately, Ukraine keeps the leading position in Europe in terms of new HIV infection cases. Altogether 325,950 new cases of HIV infection were officially registered in Ukraine since 1987. Since then 46,829 died from AIDS associated diseases in Ukraine.

The Union supports developing of the National Tripartite Cooperation Strategy on HIV and AIDS and the World of Work in Ukraine for the Period of 2018-2020 under the auspices of the National Tripartite Social and Economic Council.













In its work on the HIV/AIDS prevention among the Union members, the MTWTU has enlisted the support of two social partners – the International Labor Organization (ILO) and the International Transport Workers' Federation (ITF).





- There were conducted 5 trainings and about 40 trainers were prepared for further preventive work at maritime transport enterprises;
- The Youth Forum on reducing social discrimination associated with an HIV positive status was held: more than 60 youth leaders participated;
- 20 seafarers took part in a unique training on workplace stress and discrimination;
- As a result of carried out activities, more than
 12,000 Union members have raised their awareness on HIV;
- More than 500 people underwent free anonymous
 HIV rapid testing.






- There were organized 3 series of UNION WEEK awareness-raising seminars, which included sessions on HIV issues, as well as the anonymous HIV rapid testing. A total of 800 seafarers and cadets of maritime institutions took part in the seminars. About 120 people learned their HIV status;
- In the Kherson State Maritime Academy, the HIV/AIDS prevention module was introduced as part of 'occupational safety and labor protection'. This year, the first 200 cadets have completed the course.
- Within the first Cruise Seminar in Eastern Europe, held in June 2018 in Ukraine, the cruise industry workers also raised awareness on HIV and were given the opportunity to undergo free anonymous HIV testing;
- A Medical Manual for Seafarers was developed and produced, with a section on HIV in it.








To this day, the MTWTU:

- · Holds meetings with cadets of maritime educational institutions, drawing their attention to the problem;
- Distributes information booklets and contraceptives among seafarers;
- Publishes articles in the Union magazine and posts information in social networks, drawing public attention;









- Regularly publishes information materials that are distributed among all the MTWTU membership organizations throughout Ukraine, including crewing companies, seafarers' training and certification centers;
- The problem of HIV is always on the agenda of each seminar that the Union conducts for seafarers, as well as free anonymous HIV testing, which necessarily takes place after consulting with a specialist;
- Over the last 3 years, the MTWTU has regularly organized movie screenings for seafarers and their families. Before each movie, instead of advertising, the informational clip "I Know my HIV Status" is necessarily demonstrated.





To study the problem, the MTWTU conducts anonymous questioning of seafarers in order to find out their level of awareness and identify gaps in knowledge with the aim to overcome social discrimination and stigmatization towards HIV-positive people.



In 2017, two seafarers, who were diagnosed with HIV, addressed the MTWTU. Unfortunately, the seafarers were subjected to psychological pressure from the crewing company when they were employed. The Union provided the seafarers with psychological support, as well as contacts of specialized agencies where HIV-positive people may obtain assistance.



Over the past 10 years, the MTWTU has been struggling to raise awareness of the Union members about the potential risks of HIV, the ways of its transmission and the methods of prevention.

We hope that through the joint efforts we will be able to achieve the desired result — maximum reduction of new HIV infections, AIDS deaths and discrimination.
