MINE SAFETY TRAINING

Ukraine remains one of the most heavily mined countries and full demining may take decades. In response, certified trainers from the Main Department of the State Emergency Service of Ukraine from the Kharkiv region, supported by IUF and Vanforlife, are conducting mine safety training using 3D-printed models to demonstrate common explosive devices.

The training session was held in Odesa for members of the Marine Transport Workers' Trade Union of Ukraine. This initiative, organized in collaboration with the Agricultural Industry Workers' Trade Union (an IUF member), aims to raise awareness and enhance safety practices among the maritime community.
