At present, the Marine Transport Workers' Trade Union of Ukraine occupies its rightful place among the largest trade unions of our country, having enlarged its composition to massive 80,000 Trade Union members.

As of the beginning of 2020, the MTWTU unites almost a half of the entire seafarers' pool of Ukraine, which amounts to over 50,000 Ukrainian mariners, working onboard the foreign-flagged vessels.

We show steady growth in the number of new members: the current growth rate of seafarers' membership within the MTWTU is about 5% per annum, meaning that 2,000 new Trade Union members join the international labour movement every year.

The European Transport Workers' Federation (ETF) is a pan-European trade union organization which embraces transport trade unions from the European Union, the European Economic Area and Central and Eastern European countries. The ETF was created in 1999, but their roots in pan-European transport trade union organizations stretch back 60 years.

Today, the ETF represents more than 5 million transport workers from more than 200 transport unions and 41 European countries. These workers are found in all parts of the transport industry, on land, sea and in the air.

The MTWTU has been a member of the European Transport Workers' Federation almost since its foundation and continues its full participation in the work of the federation.



INTERNATIONAL FEDERATION OF SHIPMASTERS' ASSOCIATIONS

International Federation of Shipmasters' Associations (IFSMA) was formed in 1974 by Eight National Shipmasters' Associations to unite the world's serving shipmasters into a single professional coordinated body. It is a non-profit making apolitical organization dedicated solely to the interest of the serving shipmaster. The federation is formed of around 11,000 Shipmasters from 60 countries either through their national associations or as individual members.

The MTWTU joined IFSMA in 2019, having replenished the federation's ranks with 950 Ukrainian captains.

Shortly thereafter, IFSMA 45th Annual General Assembly was held in Helsinki, Finland, where the MTWTU First Vice Chairman Oleg Grygoriuk was elected as a Vice-President of the Federation.

CLAIMS PROCESSING

The ITF Inspector and the MTWTU continued consulting and advising seafarers on their labour rights, processing claims and visiting the seafarers onboard the ships calling the Odessa port.

In 2019, the MTWTU continued receiving applications for financial assistance from the seafarers, members of the Union, and traditionally satisfied 100% of the claims. Last year, 225 applicants-seafarers received financial assistance from the Union. Financial aid for a child birth, reimbursement of funeral expenses, sanatorium treatment or an ordinary financial aid in hard life situations – these were some of the reasons of seafarers' claims in 2019.

The Union not only satisfied 100% appeals for financial assistance coming from seafarers, the MTWTU members, but through the MTWTU-established Welfare Fund of Maritime Transport 'MORTRANS' have managed to assist the seafarers' families, as well as the various categories of applicants in distress, this or other way related to the maritime sector.

INSPECTORS, BASED IN PORTS

Globally, the International Transport Workers' Federation today has a network of 141 Inspectors, based in 121 ports all over the world. The ITF Inspectorate works on issues concerning the ITF Flag of Convenience Campaign and inspects ships to ensure the seafarers' decent pay, working and living conditions on board.

Over the last 10 years, the ITF Inspectorate has recovered more than \$310 million in seafarers' owed wages.

In 2019, the ITF Inspectorate worldwide has traditionally demonstrated high performance, having conducted 10,243 inspections globally and having recovered \$43,599,045 backpay. Recall that in 2018, the global 136 ITF Inspectors returned seafarers \$37,839,085 owed wages, having conducted 10,509 inspections.









ITF INSPECTOR IN UKRAINE

Since 2005, the MTWTU employee Nataliya Yefrimenko has been working as the only ITF Inspector in Ukraine. In 2018 Nataliya Yefrimenko together with the MTWTU handled 135 seafarers' claims and returned seafarers and their families \$1,436,555 backpay and compensation payments.

In 2019, the ITF Inspector and the MTWTU have processed 172 seafarers' claims and recovered \$1,548,807 wage arrears and compensation payments.

The MTWTU Maritime Information Center, supported by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Ukraine was launched back in 2018. The Maritime Information Center is a united platform established to provide urgent information, consulting and assistance to Ukrainian seafarers who have fallen into crisis situations abroad, as well as to their families.

Close coordination between the MFA Department of Consular Services and the Union allows the Maritime Information Center to respond as promptly as possible to the MARITIME INFORMATION CENTER

In 2019, the Maritime Information Center has processed over 200 claims from seafarers, who have fallen into emergency, crisis and challenging situations at sea.



The Memoranda are setting out the terms of trade union





Therefore, in 2019, the Union continued paying visits onboard the ships under the agreements of the fraternal ITF trade unions - parties to the Memoranda, as well as visiting the Ukrainian crews onboard the MTWTU-covered ships, calling the Ukrainian ports.

When the Union is onboard a vessel manned with Ukrainians, it always strives to please the seafarers with fresh news from home, the latest issues of the 'Maritime' Magazine and other publications, as well as to give souvenirs, like keychains, T-shirts and USB flash drives.

In addition, when the Union ship visit takes place during the winter holidays, the MTWTU also distributes tickets to the children's New Year shows among the Ukrainian crew members, so that they could please their families with a small New Year gift, despite the coming separation and distance.

In the framework of the Union ship visits, those seafarers, who do not yet possess the MTWTU Membership Card or require an update, can get it manufactured and delivered right on board while the ship is in the port.

The history of the Fund dates back to 2001.

The founders and reliable partners in the implementation of all the Fund's programs and initiatives are the Marine Transport Workers' Trade Union of Ukraine (MTWTU) and the Local Black Sea Trade Union Organization of Seafarers (LBSTUS). The founders share our opinion that today, our country and our people need charity more than ever.

Activities of the Fund are managed by the executive body - Management Board, which is composed of representatives of seafarers, port workers, maritime educational institutions and legal advisers. The Supervisory Board is also actively involved in the Fund's work and performs monitoring and regulation of its financial and economic activities. Daily work is performed by the staff of the Welfare Fund 'MORTRANS' together with volunteers.



UKRAINIAN SEAFARERS **AND THEIR FAMILIES**

Ukrainian seafarers comprise the large category of Welfare Fund beneficiaries. Ukrainian seafarer, being on shore, may require physical and psychological rehabilitation, and the Fund stands shoulder to shoulder helping and supporting him. The 'MORTRANS' also assists with repatriation of Ukrainian seafarers in case of emergency and takes due care of seafarers' families, promptly responding to every incoming appeal and making every effort to address any problem.

MARITIME INDUSTRY VETERANS

The 'MORTRANS' Welfare Fund assists the maritime industry veterans on a permanent basis. Each year, on the occasion of various local and international holidays, the Fund provides charitable financial assistance to the Organization of the Veterans of the Fleet of the State-Owned Black Sea Shipping Company and the Organization of Veterans of Odessa Maritime Transport.

The Fund regularly receives individual applications from navy veterans. After considering these applications the decision is made on the provision of recipient-oriented assistance for treatment and rehabilitation after surgeries.

In order to conduct permanent job with the above-mentioned categories of people, the Fund has established the Social Assistance Center for Lonely Disabled Persons and Maritime Transport Veterans, which operates under the Fund's auspices.

FOREIGN SEAFARERS

The Welfare Fund 'MORTRANS' as well assists foreign seafarers, working on board the ITF-covered vessels, and who are members of the ITF-affiliated trade unions, calling the ports of Ukraine, who find themselves in an emergency situation. While the MTWTU ensures its core functions of handling seafarers' claims against shipowner, the Fund assists in solving daily problems: supplies food, drinking water, hygiene products, etc.

YOUTH AND MARITIME EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS

Cadets of maritime educational institutions of Ukraine are the future elite of our country, therefore the Welfare Fund of Maritime Transport 'MORTRANS' puts a great emphasis and provides charitable assistance to students and teachers of maritime educational institutions, such as: National University 'Odessa Maritime Academy', Odessa National Maritime University, Kherson State Maritime Academy, Odessa Maritime College of Technical Fleet, Odessa Professional College of Maritime Transport and Illichevsk Maritime College, and Kyiv State Academy of Water Transport named after Hetman Petro Konashevych-Sahaydachniy.

Thus, the Fund contributed into the development of intellectual and creative abilities of the cadets (trips to Olympiads and tournaments, conferences). The Fund has

purchased computers in order to improve material and technical capacity and facilitate the learning process, as well as provided charitable assistance to cadets injured due to accidents, etc.

The Fund repeatedly helped the cadets pay for their education, when their families were facing certain financial difficulties. A prerequisite for such cadets is that they study well and are members of the Marine Transport Workers' Trade Union of Ukraine.

The Welfare Fund 'MORTRANS' conducts intellectual games for students. Among them are fascinating quest 'Odessa Maritime Traditions' and quiz game 'Union Ring', as well as the other cultural activities. The Fund promotes moral and patriotic education of the younger generation, development of love and attachment to the Homeland, its culture and traditions.



Back in 2018, the foundation was laid for close cooperation between the Marine Transport Workers' Trade Union of Ukraine and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Ukraine with the aim of supporting the Ukrainian seafarers, stranded abroad as a result of emergencies.

In 2019, the Union and the government agency continued on the cooperation, having implemented the number on initiatives for the benefit of Ukrainian seafarers and their families.

PROJECT ON CRIMINALIZATION LAUNCHED IN 2018



• CRIMINALIZATION PROJECT

The Union continues collaborating with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Ukraine in the framework of the so-called Criminalization Project. Recall that the Project has been launched in 2018 and is aimed at preventing seafarers' involvement in illegal activities at sea, as well as at ensuring protection of seafarers' rights to fair treatment during criminal proceedings, pre-trial detention and in penitentiary institutions.

Same year, the Project was presented and warmly accepted at the ITF Maritime Safety Committee. It was identified that the presented shocking problematics and statistics is common for the unions of different countries, processing similar applications and cases involving their national seafarers.

In order to address the issue of fair treatment of seafarers, detained on suspicion of committing maritime crimes, Ukraine, Georgia and the ITF have jointly developed a document which was submitted for consideration to the IMO Secretariat during the 106th Session of the IMO Legal Committee in March 2019.

The co-sponsors suggested establishing a joint IMO/ILO/ITF Working Group to develop risk assessment guidelines for seafarers on how to avoid involvement in maritime crimes and on seafarers' rights during criminal proceedings. The guidelines should include recommendations to seafarers on how to act when one becomes aware that his vessel is involved in illegal traffic; recommendations on actions to be taken in the event of detention; seafarers' rights as witnesses and defendants and contact details of governmental and non-governmental organizations providing assistance to seafarers.

Another task for the Working Group was to formulate guidelines for IMO member states on fair treatment of seafarers detained on suspicion of committing maritime crimes.

The Working Group was entrusted to develop proposals to increase the level of interaction and timely information exchange between the competent authorities of the country of detention, the country of nationality, the flag state and the other stakeholders.

The final document of the IMO LEG meeting entrusted the IMO Secretariat in coordination with the ILO and the ITF to create a tripartite Working Group to implement the proposals of Ukraine. Therefore, the first stage of the Criminalization Project implementation was completed, and a powerful foundation has been laid for the effective work and fruitful dialogue in the future.

WORKSHOPS FOR CONSULAR STAFF

In February and November 2019, workshops were held at the Diplomatic Academy of Ukraine for Consular Service Department employees, who were to be directed to work at the consular offices of Ukraine. During the workshop, the future consuls familiarized themselves with the work of the ITF, the tasks of the ITF inspectorate and discussed the issues of interaction between the MFA consular offices, the

MTWTU and the ITF inspectors.
The Union's experts have also informed the consuls on the status of the ILO Maritime Labour Convention, 2006 – the ratification of this milestone document by Ukraine has been actively promoted by the MTWTU.





PREVENTION OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING



VIDEO WARNING FOR UKRAINIAN SEAFARERS

In partnership with the MTWTU, the International Organization for Migration and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Ukraine released a social video that had been made to warn Ukrainians of the dangers that are hidden behind seafaring profession as well as to prevent the participation of Ukrainian citizens in irregular migrants' transportation using sea-going vessels and yachts.

The video informs of the official statistics: as of November 2019, 168 Ukrainian citizens were detained in Greece for the transportation of irregular migrants; 139 of them have been convicted and are serving sentences in Greek prisons and 29 citizens are pending trial.

The transportation of illegal migrants is considered a serious crime in Greece, which is sanctioned by the longest sentences possible.

In Ukraine, the programme is developed with the participation of the Ukrainian government, employers' organizations and trade unions and focuses on three jointly agreed key priorities: promoting employment and sustainable enterprises for stability and growth, promoting effective social dialogue and enhancing social protection and working conditions.

In December 2019, the MTWTU took part in the discussions of the new Decent Work Country Programme for Ukraine for 2020-2024 together with the other tripartite partners, whereof the Union represented the interests of the maritime transport workers of our country. The participants were to develop the composition of the future Programme for the next period and will be reviewed by the International Labour Organization.

IMPROVING LABOUR MARKET MANAGEMENT IN UKRAINE

In summer 2019, there was held a meeting between the MTWTU, the Federation of Trade Unions of Ukraine, the Joint Representative Body of All-Ukrainian Trade Unions at the National Level and the International Labour Organization officers: ILO National Coordinator in Ukraine Sergey Savchuk, ILO Senior Specialist on Social Dialogue and Labour Law Cristina Mihes, ILO Chief Technical Advisor on Inclusive Labour Markets for Job Creation in Ukraine Džemal Hodžić and ILO Project Assistant Kateryna Haiduk.

Recall that the International Labour Organization with the support of the Government of Denmark is implementing

a five-year program in Ukraine with the aim of improving the labour market management. The Program is named 'Inclusive labour markets for job creation in Ukraine' and its goal is to improve labour market management, reduce labour skills mismatches, promote entrepreneurship and improve social dialogue and institutional capacity of social partners.

During the meeting, the social partners discussed the current stage of the program, its first results, issues of social dialogue and collective bargaining, as well as joint projects for the future.

PREVENTION ACTIVITIES

WORK TOWARDS HIV/AIDS PREVENTION

The MTWTU stays concerned that our country remains among the first in the European region in terms of HIV infection rates, where working-age people are under the biggest threat.

According to official figures, from 50 to 60 people in Ukraine are infected every day and 10 people die due to AIDS.

Over the years, the MTWTU together with the International Labour Organization, have carried out a number of activities on HIV/AIDS prevention among the MTWTU members.

Thematic seminars, trainings, meetings with profile national and international experts, free anonymous HIV testing among seafarers, cadets and students of maritime schools of Ukraine have been held in Odessa, Kherson and Izmail.

In 2019, the MTWTU continued its successful collaboration with the ILO, aimed at addressing the problem of HIV/AIDS through the extensive outreach work.







In August 2019, the MTWTU and ILO jointly conducted an interactive training for the Union members and their families 'Fun Talks about Serious Things'. This time, the organizers decided to raise the audience's awareness on HIV in a brand new manner.

At the beginning of the training, the participants discussed seafarers' health and wellbeing issues and learnt of the HIV prevention workplace practices. The second part was held in a quiz format to help consolidate the gained knowledge. In addition, about 30 people underwent free anonymous HIV testing and took part in the prize lottery.



• 100 YEARS IN A DAY – ILO 'VIRTUAL' TOUR AROUND THE GLOBE

In 2019, to mark its 100th Anniversary, the ILO made its centenary with a day-long 'virtual' global tour, live-streaming special centenary events from 24 ILO offices around the world in a continuous, 24-hour webcast. The intention was that each office will contribute an hour of live webcasting, thus creating a global picture of the diversity and range of the ILO's work.

The tour kicked off where the world's day officially starts, on the International Date Line in Fiji, where the ILO's Suva office is responsible for activities in 11 Pacific Island member States. Next stop was Manila, followed by Beijing, Bangkok, Dhaka, Colombo, New Delhi, Pretoria, Antananarivo, Moscow, Amman, Beirut and Cairo. In Europe, after visits to Kyiv and Turin, the event at Geneva headquarters was firmly focused on the ILO's second century.

After that the tour moved – via Brussels and Abidjan – to its fifth continent, the Americas. After events in Brasilia and Buenos Aires it turned north, through Philadelphia to the UN Headquarters in New York for a 'Centenary Fireside Chat', discussing how the ILO could work best with other parts of the international system. A stop in Mexico City and, after a 23-hour whirlwind the webcast came to rest in Peru at the ILO's Regional Office for Latin America and the Caribbean.

During the tour's stop in Kyiv, the MTWTU delegates took part in the talk show to discuss the ILO activities in Ukraine along with the other 100 representatives of the local government, trade unions and employers' organizations, academia, the diplomatic corps, the ILO and the UN, students and media.

'IMEC - MTWTU - KSMA' PROJECT



In 2019, Ukraine's oldest maritime educational institution, the Kherson State Maritime Academy (KSMA), marked 185th anniversary since its foundation. The Academy not only maintains the best educational traditions, but constantly develops, opening new laboratories, classrooms and simulators.

KSMA's cooperation with world-famous shipping and crewing companies reached the national and global level back in 2011, when the Academy entered the quadrilateral agreement on cooperation with the Ministry of Education and Science, Youth and Sports of Ukraine, Marlow Navigation Company and Kherson Regional State Administration on improving the quality of maritime education.

'IMEC - MTWTU - KSMA' PROJECT



\$2,2 MILLION



In 2015, the Academy, with the support of the MTWTU, applied for a grant from the International Maritime Employers' Council (IMEC) to update Academy's training facilities, which resulted in signing of the Agreement for creation of training-simulator complex to ensure efficient training of maritime specialists.

The project budget amounted to \$2,2 million and was divided into two tranches. The first tranche was sent for the creation of new laboratories, and the second was to update the KSMA's Fire Ground and the Water Training Station.

At first, new laboratories were placed, and taking into account that all the equipment was installed by TRANSAS, the new simulators were successfully integrated into one

unique complex – 'Virtual Reality Vessel'. Secondly, the existing Academy's Water Training Station by the Dnieper River was upgraded. Two buildings constructed back in 1950s were demolished; instead there was built a complex of buildings, landscaping was carried out and modern equipment was acquired.

Evaluation of the 'IMEC – MTWTU – KSMA' project concluded with the grand opening of the modernized Water Training Station on April 25, 2019. The honorary right to cut the red ribbon was granted to KSMA Rector Vasyl Chernyavskiy, IMEC CEO Francesco Gargiulo and MTWTU First Vice Chairman Oleg Grygoriuk.

ORGANIZATION FOR SECURITY AND CO-OPERATION IN EUROPE



Throughout 2019, the Marine
Transport Workers' Trade Union of
Ukraine continued cooperation that
began in 2018 with the Organization
for Security and Co-operation in
Europe (OSCE).

The Union held a series of meetings with the Monitoring Officers from the OSCE Special Monitoring Mission

(SMM) to Ukraine – Theodoros Moutsokos, Marinka Franulovic and Irene Ballesteros – in order to discuss the issues of human trafficking for labour exploitation and impact of the conflict in Eastern Ukraine on various sectors of the country.

The OSCE Special Monitoring Mission to Ukraine was deployed on 21 March 2014, following a request to the OSCE by Ukraine's government and a consensus decision by all 57 OSCE participating States. The SMM is an unarmed, civilian mission, present on the ground 24/7 in all regions of Ukraine.

ORGANIZATION FOR SECURITY AND CO-OPERATION IN EUROPE



Its main tasks are to observe and report in an impartial and objective way on the situation in Ukraine; and to facilitate dialogue among all parties to the crisis.

During the meetings, the parties discussed the involvement of Ukrainian seafarers into crimes at sea, and, inter alia, the Criminalization Project of the Union and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Ukraine, and the MTWTU Maritime Information Center. Recall that the Center was opened in 2018 with the support of the Ministry with the goal to raise

seafarers' awareness and to prevent seafarers' involvement in maritime crimes, like illegal cargo transportation and human trafficking.

The MTWTU and the OSCE representatives have agreed upon further collaboration aimed at addressing the existing problems.



ITF GLOBAL CONFERENCE

In September 2019, the ITF held its third global trade union conference called Maritime Roundtable (MRT) in the city of Colombo, Sri Lanka.

The Maritime Roundtable provides a space for union activists and future leaders to develop their skills and empower each other for the benefit of maritime workers around the world. This event is all

about using the firsthand experience, knowledge and ideas of seafarers and dockers to shape the ITF's future maritime activities for the benefit of workers on the ground.

The MRT conferences are aimed at bringing together activists from maritime unions across the world. Thus, on behalf of Ukraine and in consultations with the MTWTU, two cadets from maritime educational schools of Ukraine – National University 'Odessa Maritime Academy' and Kherson State Maritime Academy – were invited to take part in the conference and have decently represented our country and the Union.

WORLDWIDE ITF INSPECTORS SEMINAR

The Worldwide Inspectors' Seminar is the event that brings the ITF inspectors and contacts together to refocus and retool them, promoting the goals and objectives of the Flags of Convenience/Port of Convenience and other campaigns.

Recall that the MTWTU today is the only maritime ITF affiliate in Ukraine, and the only ITF Inspector in our

country, Nataliya Yefrimenko, is also an employee of the Marine Transport Workers' Trade Union of Ukraine. As one of the ITF Inspectorate squad, in September 2019, Nataliya also took part in the Worldwide ITF Inspectors Seminar.

WORLDWIDE ITF INSPECTORS SEMINAR



ITF CAMPAIGN AGAINST GERMAN SHIPOWNER BLUMENTHAL

One of the items on the agenda of the ITF Worldwide Inspectors' Seminar in Sri Lanka was the outcomes of the large-scale ITF campaign against the German shipowner Blumenthal, who had attracted the federation's attention with systemic abuse of the seafarers' rights.

CAMPAIGN AGAINST GERMAN SHIPOWNER BLUMENTHAL

Under the campaign, the ITF Inspectors collected data on each of the company's 30 ships and came on board to check the working and living conditions of the crews. They have managed to reveal some horrific concerns of seafarers' welfare and health – systemic mistreatment of seafarers across Blumenthal's vessels and intimidation, threats and abusive conditions onboard.

The MTWTU fully supported the ITF campaign against the Blumenthal, which hires a significant number of Ukrainian seafarers and often disregards its employment obligations under the respective agreements and national flag legislation.

18TH SAILOR TODAY SEA SHORE AWARD



Sailor Today Sea Shore Award was introduced in 2001 with a vision to promote seafaring profession, to bring it to the forefront, giving it the recognition it so rightly deserves.

For 19 years already, the awarding ceremony has been held to appreciate, recognize, encourage and felicitate the achievements and outstanding services of seafarers and shipping organizations.

The awarding ceremony took place in Mumbai, India.

IMEC CONFERENCE



In April 2019, a conference 'The Human Element in Marine Automation' arranged by the International Maritime Employers' Council (IMEC) was held in Southampton, United Kingdom.

Among the 200 conference participants were seafarers, representatives of various shipping companies, the members of IMEC, maritime higher education institutions of different countries, international organizations IMO and ITF, as well as leading industry experts on the automation and human factor.

The Marine Transport Workers' Trade Union of Ukraine was also invited to take part in the conference, as well as the leadership of the National University 'Odessa Maritime Academy' and cadets of the NU 'OMA' and Kherson State Maritime Academy.



The main subject of the discussion was the most prominent challenges that the maritime industry is facing in the context of automation and digitalization.

One of the sessions on the agenda was a panel discussion with the participation of the Ukrainian cadets, representing, together with their colleagues from Warsash University, the so-called Generation Z.

MARITIME FORUM ETC-2019

In June 2019, there was held an annual International Forum on Seafarers' Education, Training and Crewing (ETC-2019).

This time the event was dedicated to the celebration of the 75th Anniversary of the National University 'Odessa Maritime Academy'.

Organized for the seventh consecutive year, ETC-2019 attracted over 100 organizations and companies from 25 countries of the world. Among them were maritime universities and colleges, major shipping companies, crewing agencies, manufacturers of specialized equipment for the shipping industry and international banks.

The MTWTU was also there, among the key participants and coorganizers of the project.

During the two-day forum, the Union's exhibition booth was visited by over 700 people.





TRADE UNIONS OF POLAND



In summer 2019, there took place the meeting between the MTWTU and the Polish trade unions, ITF affiliates – the National Maritime Section NSZZ 'Solidarność' and the Polish Seafarers' Union.

The representatives of the unions discussed the possibility of implementing joint social projects and paid attention to the prevailing problems of seafarers' and port workers' employment.

The parties have also drafted the Memorandum of Understanding provided for mutual consultations on employment and working conditions of Polish and Ukrainian seafarers onboard the foreign-flagged ships, improvement

of the unions' social services and mutual resolution of labour disputes that may arise.

Already in autumn 2019, the delegation of the Local MTWTU Organization in the Kherson Sea Commercial Port paid a visit to the trade union 'Solidarność' in Poland. During their trip, the Ukrainian delegation managed to meet the Dockers' Unions of DCT Gdańsk and the Port of Gdańsk, exchange experience and learn of the dockers' job in Poland as well as of the dockers' trade union movement there.

It is expected that the cooperation between the Ukrainian and Polish trade unions will further continue and our Polish colleagues will reciprocate the visit in the shortest time possible.

FLEET CREW MEETINGS



Among the events of 2019 are also fleet crew meetings for seafarers, organized by the Union's partner companies in order to train their personnel. During these seminars, the MTWTU traditionally speaks about the seafarers' labour rights, stipulated by their employment agreements and international labour regulations, presents most recent Union activities, achievements and social programs available for the Union members, when the ITF Inspector in Ukraine introduces the work of the ITF Inspectorate, giving detailed consideration to the protection of the seafarers' labour rights and presenting claim-handling statistics.





In October 2019, ASP Crew
Management Services Ukraine
arranged a seminar for the company's
seafarers in Odessa. Currently,
the company employs marine
personnel from the Philippines, India,
Bangladesh, Myanmar, Georgia,
Australia and Ukraine. The company
as well holds such seminars every year
and always invites the Union and the
ITF in Ukraine to talk to the seafarers.

ANGLO-EASTERN UKRAINE

The MTWTU has long been enjoying close cooperation with Anglo-Eastern Ukraine, which is evidenced by the significant increase in the number of collective bargaining agreements signed: since 2015, their number more than doubled, bringing the total amount of MTWTU-covered ships to 34. Today, Anglo-Eastern office in Odessa employs about 800 Ukrainian

seafarers and their search for highly-skilled mariners of all ranks continues expanding. The company also offers favorable conditions for cadets, offering career growth opportunities to the young seafarers.

Anglo-Eastern conducts seminars for their seafarers on the annual basis in order to discuss the company's priorities, policies and plans. Another regular seminar was held in June 2019, with the participation of the MTWTU, to focus on the role of the Ukrainian crews within the company's structure, to analyze feedback received from shipowners, to discuss commercial aspects of ships' daily operations and the issues of seafarers' health and wellbeing.

FLEET CREW MEETINGS





Solstad Offshore with more than 50 years of experience in various shipping segments now employs about 4,000 seafarers for their 137 ships. Although the company has long been hiring Ukrainian seafarers, Solstad Offshore today continues discovering new prospects



for market development here. As of today, all Ukrainian seafarers, employed by Solstad Offshore Ukraine, are members of the Marine Transport Workers' Trade Union of Ukraine.

The company representatives have also been genuinely interested in the maritime education system of Ukraine and job opportunities for young seafarers. Therefore, in 2019, the MTWTU and the National University 'Odessa Maritime Academy' signed an agreement with Solstad Offshore Ukraine , providing for cooperation in training, internships and employment of the academy students.

FLEET CREW MEETINGS







Another seminar for crew members was held in October 2019 by Wilson Crewing Agency Odessa Ltd.

Wilson has its main office in Bergen, Norway, and its agencies in Germany, the Netherlands, Iceland and the Russian Federation. The Wilson fleet consists of 114 vessels, ranging from 1500-8500 dwt, whereof 92 are owned by the Wilson group. The number of owned vessels in fleet places the company among the largest shipping operators within the European short sea segment. Today, Wilson employs about 1,650 workers, 1,500 of whom are seafarers.

For 12 years now, the company has been providing highly paid and steady jobs to Ukrainian seafarers. One of the two company's crewing offices is located in Odessa. Currently, about 400 Ukrainian seafarers work on board the company's ships and each of them is a member of the MTWTU. The company carries out information seminars for its employees on the annual basis and the Union is always invited there to represent its topics.

The topics on the agenda of the ITF-supported event included global trade union movement, ITF and ITF Inspectorate, seafarers' wellbeing, seafarers' employment contracts and collective bargaining agreements, Maritime Labour Convention, 2006 and update on the industry locally. ITF Coordinator from Croatia Romano Peric and ITF Inspector from Spain Gonzalo Galan especially arrived to Ukraine to contribute to the Union Week seminar.

The seafarers also took part in virtual reality trainings on safety and ship operations, allowing them to enhance their professional skills. During the seminar seafarers were also able to undergo free medical tests to check themselves for HIV, hepatitis B and C, syphilis and blood sugar levels.

SECOND CRUISE SEMINAR IN EASTERN EUROPE

Cruise Seminar



The second seminar in Eastern Europe for cruise industry workers was held in Odessa in June 2019.

The event was organized under the auspices of the International Transport Workers' Federation by its affiliates: the Norwegian Seafarers' Union, German trade union ver.di, Italian Confederation of Trade Unions FIT-CISL and the MTWTU.

The unions have been organizing cruise seminars in the Philippines, India, Malaysia and Indonesia for more than 13 years, and since 2018 the seafarers form Eastern Europe also have a chance to participate in this education and leisure activity.

In 2019, the seminar was attended by 44 participants from Romania, Hungary and Ukraine, who spent wonderful days in sunny Odessa discovering new facts about their jobrelated issues like labour rights and the global trade union movement. Moreover, the participants discussed cultural differences between people of various nationalities, shared life situations arising from the lack of intercultural understanding, talked about various forms of bullying, sexual harassment in the workplace, discrimination and ways to counter it.

Health and well-being of people employed on cruise ships was another important topic on the seminar agenda. In addition to HIV/ AIDS awareness-raising session, under the joint MTWTU/ILO project each seminar participant could undergo free anonymous HIV testing.

Recall that in 2018 the MTWTU and All Japan Seamen's Union launched the unique joint educational project, allowing Ukrainian seafarers enhance their knowledge of English. Thanks to the cooperation between the ITF trade unions, seafarers as well as students of maritime educational institutions of Ukraine have become




a part of the unique project allowing them to enhance their language skills absolutely free of charge.

After the entrance test, all the students get divided into groups to study entry and advanced levels. The groups study three times a week at the MTWTU Maritime Union Center.

It is noteworthy that the training course has been developed particularly for this project. Thus, seafarers have the opportunity not only to improve their English language skills, but to refresh their knowledge of labour rights, international legislation and collective bargaining.

REST & STUDY FOR MOST ACTIVE SEAFARERS







In December 2019, the Union-organized a three-day retreat and study for most active trade unionists and their families in the Carpathian resort; the trip combined both, training and leisure.

During the training, the MTWTU experts spoke about the global and local trade union movement, seafarers' employment contract and collective bargaining agreement, ILO Maritime Labour Convention, 2006 and national flag state legislation, as well as presented some case studies. In addition, the Union experts coached practical training, where the seminar participants, divided into groups, acted on behalf

The participants also underwent training with coach and psychologist Maria Didenko. Using interactive techniques, the seafarers' families worked out such issues as conflict management, family planning and microclimate, choice and responsibility, and much more.

Another career counseling training on 'How to Find Direct Employment' was led by the experienced First Officer Denis Lysiuk, RhumbFleet project founder, who has been conducting practical trainings for seafarers for several years already. At the training, the participants discussed what instruments can and should be used to find employment, how to behave during an interview, how to present yourself to the employer in the best possible way; as well as the priorities of getting a job directly and the right approach to filling out a CV.

➤ Seafarers studied the **Behavioral Based Safety Course** presented by the Safety Vision Company with more than 20 years of experience. The course was not just to learn basic regulations that the seafarers are required to know under main maritime conventions, but to learn how to identify the original cause of problem to be able terminate it in the outset. At the end of the seminar, seafarers received the Behavioral Basic Safety course certificates, allowing for more prestigious maritime employment.

 Offshore wind power is rapidly developing today, and there is no doubt that this industry is in need for proper service and qualified marine specialists. Therefore, another MTWTU seminar, moderated by Chief Officer Sergei Romashko, founder of Next Wave educational project for seafarers, was dedicated to the topic of offshore wind engineering, prospects for seafarers and potential employers and positions in demand: where Ukrainians can find such jobs, on which stage of construction they can apply their knowledge and how they can plan their training in advance.





→ 'Taxes and Retirement for Seafarers in a Plain Language' was another popular topic to discuss among seafarers. The Union's lawyer spoke about the regulatory framework and legal requirements of seafarers' income taxation and their pensions. Also, the participants discussed and analyzed real cases from the seafarers' lives, mass-media updates, etc. Everyone had a chance to share own opinion and experience, in particular, regarding the possible options of well-being insurance upon reaching retirement age.

Many seafarers are deeply concerned of how to live a decent life after the end of a career, how to financially protect themselves and their beloved ones in the future. Therefore, another MTWTU-arranged seminar was dedicated to **Seafarers' Financial Literacy**, where the speakers were Ukraine's leading financial expert Eric Nyman and successful asset manager Sergey Shvets. The participants discovered the latest investment opportunities available for Ukrainians, learned how to properly manage personal finances to achieve set goals, how to avoid mistakes in managing finances and how savings can work effectively for seafarers.

- ▶ Seafarers' Health Onboard by psychologist Maria Didenko gave the participants an opportunity to discuss the most pressing issues of seafarers' wellbeing during their employment at sea. In addition, each seminar participant received the Union-published Medical Handbook for Seafarers, which was developed by leading transport medicine experts in 2018.
- The topic of **Stress and its Effect on the Human Body** was discussed during the MTWTU-arranged seminar, led by Lyudmila Krikun, psychologist, existential consultant, member of the Ukrainian Association of Existential Consultants and Psychotherapists. The coach spoke about formation, impact, types and phases of stress and shared tips that help get out of stress.

- ➤ Training for seafarers, dedicated to **Communication Secrets,** was facilitated by Ivan Nenov, honored journalist of Ukraine, candidate of political sciences, associate professor and member of the National Writers' Unions of Ukraine and Bulgaria. There the seafarers discussed how to build credibility, learned to manage anger and resolve conflicts in a team.
- 'How to Develop Charisma' was a central subject of another seminar, facilitated by Ivan Nenov, where he elaborated on the matters of mimics, gestures, and body language that carry a lot of valuable information about a person, such as temperament, education, and level of self-assurance.

- by the MTWTU for the wives of seafarers and raised various issues, faced by the wives of seafarers: problems associated with women's health, psychoemotional state, self-realization and personal space. In addition, a lack of unified approach to child rearing was discussed and how it affects the children and their self-esteem.
- Another seminar for the wives of seafarers held by the psychologist Marina Volkova was called 'Adult Topics for Children'. There, the participants received a number of practical tips on how to talk with children about the most difficult issues, how to behave during such conversations and what subjects are hurtful for children.





AWARENESS-RAISING OUTSIDE ODESSA



Each year, following seafarers' requests, the MTWTU widens the geography of its awareness-raising activities.

Thus, another workshop was held in Kherson, which was attended by about 70 seafarers and cadets of the Kherson State Maritime Academy. The Union seminars are always a source of valuable information on the MTWTU and ITF activities, achievements and future plans, as well as an update on the current situation in the maritime industry of Ukraine.

AWARENESS-RAISING OUTSIDE ODESSA

Another union awareness-raising seminar for 50 participants was held in the city of Izmail. At the seminar, the seafarers learnt of the current projects of the MTWTU and the ITF, of the Union's initiatives to enlarge the number of jobs for Ukrainian seafarers and to improve their working conditions onboard the foreign-owned ships, as well as of the Union's educational and social projects.

The other topics of concern for the seafarers have also been covered: retirement, taxation, medical job-related issues and so on. But the leading results of such meetings is the communication of the Union and seafarers, who are free to ask any concerning questions.





WORKING WITH YOUTH



In 2019, the MTWTU continued on close cooperation with the maritime educational institutions of Ukraine. Throughout the year, there has been held a number of activities, aimed and developed especially for Ukrainian maritime students and cadets – the future seafarers of our country.

 In February 2019, there was held a meeting with the cadets of the National University 'Odessa Maritime
 Academy' and the Maritime College of Technical Fleet of the NU 'OMA', initiated by the MTWTU and the Ministry




of Foreign Affairs of Ukraine.
The event gathered together about 150 future seafarers and was dedicated to the prevention of seafarers' involvement in maritime crimes. At the meeting, the joint Criminalization Project of the Union and the Ministry was also presented.

In August 2019, National University 'Odessa Maritime Academy' welcomed the new-comers, who have joined the Academy's ranks as the first-year full-time students. The MTWTU local organization of cadets has been long successfully operating at the NU 'OMA', and over **200 new students** replenished the ranks of the MTWTU members, having joined the Union's organizational link last year.

- The MTWTU also participated in inauguration into cadets and graduation ceremonies of the following maritime educational institutions of Ukraine: National University 'Odessa Maritime Academy', Odessa Maritime College of Technical Fleet and the Danube Institute of NU 'OMA' and Kherson State Maritime Academy.
- Career-oriented seminar 'First Steps Onboard: from Cadet to Chief Officer in Five Years' was held for the cadets brand new seafarers in August 2019. The seminar was aimed to discuss how to predict and reduce the risk of unfortunate situations at sea and how to act if these occur. The cadets were taught that professional growth is impossible without constant knowledge replenishment, usage of colleagues' experience and learning from own mistakes.

In early October 2019, the MTWTU launched a new format of events for the young generation of trade unionists. 


