MTWTU PROPOSALS APPROVED BY IMO LEGAL COMMITTEE

The IMO Legal Committee, at its 112th session held on March 24-28, approved the proposals by MTWTU and the Embassy of Ukraine in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland aimed at preventing abandonment of seafarers.



The MTWTU, in cooperation with the Embassy, analysed all cases of abandonment of Ukrainian seafarers, and as a result, a document was submitted to the IMO Legal Committee with specific proposals aimed at preventing abandonment, including:

- To supplement the standard form of the report on the inspection of the ship by the port state control with data on documentary evidence of the shipowner's financial liability in case of abandonment;
- Conduct a concentrated campaign to inspect ships for the availability of financial security providers for shipowner's liability;
- To implement the IMO/ILO Guidelines on how to deal with seafarers abandonment cases into the national legislation of Member States.

At the national level, the MTWTU also addressed the Ministry for Communities and Territories Development of Ukraine, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Ukraine and the State Service for Maritime, Inland Waterway Transport and Shipping of Ukraine with a proposal to establish a joint workgroup to develop a procedure for interaction between the competent state authorities to provide assistance to seafarers in crisis situations, including cases of abandonment.

STRENGTHENING YOUTH MOVEMENT

The MTWTU visited the students of the Maritime Transport Professional College of the National University "Odessa Maritime Academy".

The young specialists got acquainted with the MTWTU activities, learned about seafarers' rights and opportunities offered by the Trade Union. The youth also took part in the MTWTU Youth UNION-QUIZ, an interactive game that tested their knowledge of the maritime industry, international standards and the trade union movement.

More than 200 students received useful information on how the MTWTU supports seafarers at all stages of their careers — from training to going on board and protecting their labour rights.



SAIL SMART: MTWTU YOUTH LEARNED HOW TO PROTECT PERSONAL DATA

In modern times, personal data is becoming increasingly vulnerable, and in the context of martial law, the risks to privacy are only growing. That is why the MTWTU Youth Council, together with the IMO Goodwill Maritime Ambassador in Ukraine and with the support of the Representative of the Verkhovna Rada of Ukraine's Commissioner for Human Rights in the Odesa region, held a meeting as part of the initiative Sail Smart: Valuable Insights — "It's not just "data". It's you".

Regional Coordinator Serhii Fisiukov told the MTWTU youth how to protect their personal data from leaks, why it is important to maintain digital hygiene and how our rights change in wartime. The participants received useful advice and real-life examples to help them avoid threats in the digital space.







STARTING CAREER WITH THE UNION

One of the main areas of work with youth is the MTWTU's seminars on the specifics of seafarers' work, the trade union movement and ways to protect their interests, as awareness of their labour rights from the very beginning of their professional career is a guarantee of safety and confidence in the future.

Thus, during the meeting with the 1st-3rd year cadets of the Danube Institute of the National University "Odesa Maritime Academy", the Inspector of the International Transport Workers' Federation (ITF) in Ukraine and her assistant told about the labour rights that every seafarer should know, especially a cadet who is going on his first voyage. The youth learned how to avoid fraud, use digital resources, including the ITF's Look Up the Ship app, and how to properly contact the union or ITF for help. Such measures help cadets feel confident and protected from the very first voyage.







UNION DENT: NEW LEVEL OF MEDICAL SERVICES ACCESSIBILITY

The MTWTU, in cooperation with the fraternal German trade union ver.di, the Welfare Fund of Maritime Transport "MORTRANS" and the medical partner UNION DENT Clinic, implemented a large-scale initiative — a campaign awareness-raising campaign on dental hygiene for MTWTU cadets.

The foundation for such programmes is the long-standing cooperation between the MTWTU and ver.di.

Today, 100 cadets have already received a full range of dental services and continue their treatment from UNION DENT. Each young project participant receives a professional dental consultation, preventive dental treatment, individual recommendations for dental care, and a hygiene set free-of-charge. Also, among the benefits of the initiative, there is a chance to win a modern irrigator that provides effective teeth brushing at home.

"This is the first consultation I had where the doctor calmly explained and demonstrated everything to me. Now I definitely know how to properly care for my teeth and why prevention is more important than treatment. I am sincerely grateful to the Trade Union, the WF "MORTRANS" and ver.di, without whose support this project wouldn't have been possible!" shares Maksym, a cadet of the National University "Odesa Maritime Academy".

The MTWTU together with the German trade union ver.di continue to work to ensure that our members have access to the necessary assistance and feel confident — both during their studies and in their future profession.
