SEAFARERS' DOCUMENTS VALIDITY EXTENDED



We are glad to announce that the Ministry of Infrastructure of Ukraine addressed the letter to International Maritime Organisation clarifying the measures adopted and enforced by Ukraine regarding the validity of the qualification documents of the seafarers who a currently onboard. Thus, Certificates of competency, Certificates of proficiency, Seafarers' identity documents and Medical certificates of those seafarers who are staying onboard are now extended up to December 31st, 2020.

LEARNING ENGLISH WITH THE UNION

JOINT MTWTU&EDMARINE SEMINARS FOR SEAFARERS



This month there were two educational seminars for Ukrainian seafarers held by the MTWTU with support of the educational project for seafarers EdMarine. The main topic of the first seminar was the review of the International Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea (COLREG-72). The participants of the event discussed the main provisions of the document and also considered the most frequent causes of ships' collision on the examples of the real-life events.

This topic was relevant not only for serving masters and chief officers, but also for cadets - the next generation of senior officers.

The second educational seminar held by the MTWTU and the EdMarine learning platform was for the engine crew and was aimed at increasing the level of professional knowledge in the operation of modern ship power plants. The participants have studied the basic concepts of engine control system and its subsystems, learned about modern requirements to limit emissions during operation of marine diesel engines, discussed the issues of fault detection of electronic-hydraulic system elements and many other ,atters.




UNION INVITES TO THE MOVIES




